## And Here We Go Again

We're long past the time when the "year" starts on January 1. We understand that we have the fiscal year and school year and calendar year, and yes, the church year. The church year starts on the First Sunday of Advent, or four Sundays before Christmas. We get so familiar with the church year that we struggle to see its paradox, its challenge to us. Just as winter in the northern hemisphere is about to shut everything down, we start to think about God coming into our world. What should be a sleepy, cold, dark part of the year explodes with the dazzling light of the angels, the songs of Mary and Elizabeth, and the warm glow of shepherds crowded in to see the baby king. Just about the time we're ready to slow down for the cold winter months, the paradox of Advent and Christmas starts our year off. It's a story where all the really powerful people in the narrative (King Herod, Caesar Augustus) take a back seat to a Galilean maiden and an infant born in exile. This part of the church calendar is structured, the four weeks before Christmas being a season of preparation (Advent), and the time between Christmas and Epiphany (January 6) being celebration and the early stories of Jesus's transition from infant to Galilean teacher *par excellence*. The church year is just beginning and we're already grappling with the idea of Immanuel (*God With Us*) realized in the birth of Jesus.

About the time we become comfortable with Jesus as *God With Us*, we go into another preparation/celebration cycle. In the dead of winter, we start a seven-week countdown to Easter. Long before spring bathes the northern hemisphere in new life, Lent calls us to new life in our souls. And on the week following the Paschal Full Moon, the second paradox of the church year presents itself: life which springs from death. The resurrection of Jesus opens up the promise of life beyond death. God triumphs over death by dying, and the hope of eternity is shaped in the passion and suffering of Holy Week.

But we're not done yet. Just as we're contemplating the meaning of Easter, we go into a fifty-day countdown to Pentecost. We come to understand that in Jesus, the Divine and the human took up residence together. Pentecost takes that interdwelling of Divine and human a step further. In the gift of the Holy Spirit to every follower of Jesus, God resides in us. We become the living tabernacles of God. Another paradox to ponder. And we're only halfway through the year (calendar or church).

All of this can feel busy or rushed, but that's because we zoom from one paradox to another in very set sequence and timing. So, put on your running shoes and take a deep breath. Another church year is upon us, and away we go!
